I would like to thank J. David Moore for stepping in as our Interim Artistic Director this past season and leading the chorus during a unique period. David has described himself as the tugboat guiding the One Voice ocean liner to its next destination. MINNESOTA'S LGBTA One Voice Mixed Chorus - Minnesota's LGBTQA chorus and one of the largest LGBTQA mixed choruses in the country -MIXED CHORUS is known for its musical excellence, unique programming and a strong commitment to community outreach. One Voice's 125 singing members span the ages of 16 to 85, and are accompanied by a large "Fifth Section" of non-singing volunteers. Together, they dedicate their energy and voices to the One Voice mission: "Building community and creating social change by raising our voices in song." Along with the a capella ensemble OVation, One Voice has performed for thousands of people in the Twin Cities, Greater Minnesota and beyond, bringing messages of hope, inclusiveness and equality to communities outside the Twin Cities area where LGBTQA resources are often hard to find. For over 33 years their community engagement and education programs have inspired transformation through passionate, vibrant, and creative performances at concerts, during community engagement tours and with the pioneering OUT in Our Schools program. One Voice is described by Chorus America as "one of the region's best ensembles."

OVATION MUSIC DIRECTOR

David (he/him) is the founder and music director of the First Readings Project, a chamber choir that acts as a resource for composers in the development of new work. He has won numerous grants, awards, and residencies from organizations such as ASCAP, the Jerome Foundation, the American Composers Forum, and was the recipient of the 2001 McKnight Fellowship for Performing Musicians, along with his a cappella group Dare To Breathe. Well known to One Voice singers and audiences, the chorus has performed many of his compositions and arrangements. David also served as coach of OVation, the One Voice small ensemble, in 2012 and 2015–2016.

Emily's (she/her) music career began at age 6 when she joined the Children's Choir at Nativity of Mary Church in Bloomington, and for over 30 years she continued to study and teach choral and instrumental music. After earning a Bachelor's in Music from Gustavus Adolphus College, Emily worked with students of all ages as a freelance piano teacher, community theatre vocal director, conductor for youth and adult ensembles. Emily returned to school earning a Music Education degree from UMN and currently teaches 6-12 Music at Community of Peace Academy in St Paul.

Paul Kovacovic (he/him) has been the guest soloist with several orchestras, as well as the accompanist for artists such as singer-songwriter Ann Reed and Las Vegas entertainer and television host Tony Sandler. Kovacovic has won first prizes in the Thursday Musical, Schubert Club, and Indiana University Piano Concerto Competitions. Paul loves to teach and compose as well as perform. His piece Variations Catastrophiques won the Eric Stokes Song Contest and was performed by the new music ensemble Zeitgeist. Other performed compositions include Legend (violin concerto), Through the Darkness (piano concerto), To Earth and Back (symphony), and Our Voice of Truth (chorus).

In addition to his work with OVation, Gary (he/him) leads the vocal and choral programs at North Hennepin Community College and St. Timothy Lutheran Church of St. Paul, and also serves as music director for Mixed Precipitation's critically-acclaimed Pickup Truck Opera. Gary's scores have been presented by BBC Two, C-SPAN, Minnesota Opera, Madison Square Garden, and the Center for Interfaith Relations. A Chorus America Education and Community Outreach Award recipient and American Composers Forum grantee, he earned music degrees with honors from Northern Kentucky University and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Gary's discography includes a dozen recordings with Cantus, alt-rock and classical discs, and three solo albums.

But first, I must extend my gratitude to the 12+ member team who worked tirelessly to make this moment happen. One Voice ran a thoughtful, 9-month long, highly involved, multi-faceted, national search that resulted in finding the right person at the right time. And the result is someone to be very excited about!

Drumroll please...

We are proud to announce the appointment of Kimberly Waigwa (goes by Waigwa | they/them) as our new Artistic Director. Waigwa has the choral chops, creative mind, and fresh vision that will guide One Voice successfully in the years to come. Most importantly, they have a proven and heartfelt commitment to building community and creating social change by raising their voice in song. Waigwa will officially join One Voice staff on July 17!

Waigwa is a conductor and educator with a focus on social justice and community building through and within music making—and central to
