# the Jane Ramseyer Miller COMMISSIONING FUND

One of the gifts Jane has brought to One Voice is a passion for supporting living composers. We have experienced this in the dozens of contemporary, sometimes daunting, compositions that she has introduced to the chorus. These pieces are frequently met with skepticism but as we dig into the score—often collaborating with the composer via Zoom or in person—these songs have become some of our favorites.

After meeting composer Gwyneth Walker in the hotel hot tub at a GALA Choruses Festival, Jane commissioned "Writings from the Wall," honoring the 10th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall. And that was only the beginning; during Jane's 27 years as Artistic Director, she commissioned over 40 compositions including several that have been performed internationally.

In honor of her role in supporting the visibility and artistry of under-represented living composers, One Voice has established the **Jane Ramseyer Miller Commissioning Fund**. This fund will support future One Voice commissions by LGBTQ and BIPOC composers.

Just in her second year with One Voice, Jane began commissioning new songs from living composers with a 4-movement composition by Jena Root based on the memoirs of suffragette Ethel Smyth. It premiered in 1999 at a concert featuring women composers, titled "Hear Me Roar."

#### FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

After 27 years conducting One Voice Mixed Chorus, Jane Ramseyer Miller is retiring from her role as Artistic Director. To say we will miss her is an enormous understatement.

For nearly three decades Jane has been the driving force behind One Voice's powerful programming, groundbreaking commissions, and commitment to sharing stories that are often overlooked or go untold. any Artistic Director's job description. She has guided the organization with unwavering purpose during critical periods and embedded social justice into the One Voice ethos.

During these final concerts, I hope you will join me in embracing her transition and, more importantly, to say a hearty and heartfelt thank you. MINNESOTA'S LGBTA One Voice Mixed Chorus — Minnesota's LGBTQA chorus and one of the largest LGBTQA mixed choruses in the country — is known for its musical excellence, unique programming and a strong commitment to community

outreach. One Voice's 125 singing members span the ages of 16 to 85, and are accompanied by a large "Fifth Section" of nonsinging volunteers. Together, they dedicate their energy and voices to the One Voice mission: "Building community and creating social change by raising our voices in song." Along with the a capella ensemble OVation, One Voice has performed for thousands of people in the Twin Cities, Greater Minnesota and beyond, bringing messages of hope, inclusiveness and equality to communities outside the Twin Cities area where LGBTQA resources are often hard to find. For over 33 years their community engagement and education programs have inspired transformation through passionate. vibrant, and creative performances at concerts, during community engagement tours and with the pioneering OUT in Our Schools program. One Voice is described by Chorus America as "one of the region's best ensembles."



## QUEER SPACE collective

**QUEER SPACE Collective** creates space for LGBTQ+ youth to feel safe and empowered to be their true selves. Launched in April 2021, the collective is the first mentorship program created specifically for LGBTQ+ youth in Minnesota. It provides resources to LGBTQ+ youth and their caregivers and raises awareness about the inequities they face in our communities. Jean-Nickolaus Tretter: 1946-2022

The Jean-Nickolaus Tretter Collection in Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Studies is the largest collection of LGBTQ-specific materials in the upper Midwest and one of the largest in the country. Started by Jean-Nickolaus Tretter, a Minnesota-born archivist, the Tretter Collection holds approximately 3,500 linear feet of material — including books, periodicals, grey literature, personal and organizational records, pamphlets, artifacts and audiovisual materials.

The collection is national and international in scope (featuring materials in approximately 58 languages), but is especially strong in materials documenting the history of LGBTQ people, organizations, and communities in the Upper Midwest. The Tretter also serves as a center for LGBT and queer ideas, hosting panel discussions, community conversations, and other events designed to support critical inquiry into LGBTQ pasts. https://www.lib.umn.edu/collections/special/tretter

## **South High School Gender Sexuality Alliance**

is a (GSA) student-run organization offering safe spaces for LGBTQ+ and allied youth in order to build community and organize around issues impacting them in their schools and communities.

GSAs have emerged as vehicles for deep social change related to racial, gender, and educational justice. Research confirms that the presence of a GSA in schools has a positive and lasting effect on student health, wellness, and academic performance. One Voice is excited to partner with members of the South HS GSA as hosts for our January 14 & 15 Generation concerts.

#### JANF RAMSFYFR MILLER



ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Jane Ramseyer Miller (she/her) is in her 27th year as Artistic Director for One Voice and also serves as Artistic Director for GALA Choruses, a national association of 200 LGBTQ choruses. In that role she has been instrumental in cultivating GALA's New Harmony resources, addressing Equity, Access and Belonging. She holds Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota and a BA in Psychology from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada. Ramseyer Miller has served as Music Director for several church choirs as well as for TransVoices, Calliope Women's Chorus, Fierra Voce Femmina, and Voices for Peace – a multi-cultural youth choir. She especially enjoys creative community collaborations and has created choral music with Ikidowin Youth Theater, Shakopee Women's Correctional Facility, In the Heart of the Beast Puppet and Mask Theatre, Kairos Dance Theatre, Mu Daiko, and Teens Rock the Mic. Career highlights include over 25 new commissioned works—including Bayard Rustin: The Man Behind the Dream—and One Voice's 2022 ReMembering: Singing Water film.

#### STEPHEN SWANSON

Steve Swanson (he/him) is a pianist based in St. Paul. An active freelancer, Steve frequently collaborates with choirs, vocalists, and instrumentalists throughout the Twin Cities. Choirs he has accompanied include The Singers, VocalPoint, One Voice Mixed Chorus, Singers in Accord, Chorus Polaris, and the MMEA All-State Choirs, as well as numerous high-school and college choirs throughout the metro area. He recorded his first album of art song, "Songs from the Heart" with soprano Melissa Holm-Johansen, in 2020. In addition to his freelance work, Steve holds a position at Central Presbyterian Church. He graduated from Concordia College in 2004 and obtained a Master of Music degree in Collaborative Piano & Coaching from the University of Minnesota in 2010.

Emily's music career began at age 6 when she joined the Children's Choir at Nativity of Mary Church in Bloomington, and for over 30 years she continued to study and teach choral and instrumental music. After earning a Bachelor's in Music from Gustavus Adolphus College, Emily worked with students of all ages as a freelance piano teacher, community theatre vocal director, conductor for youth and adult ensembles. Emily returned to school earning a Music Education degree from UMN and currently teaches 6-12 Music at Community of Peace Academy in Saint Paul.

#### **GARY RUSCHMAN**



**OVATION MUSIC DIRECTOR** 

Gary Ruschman (he/him) is an in-demand conductor, performer, and composer who works in a broad range of musical traditions. In addition to his work with *OVation* Gary leads the vocal and choral programs at North Hennepin Community College and St. Timothy Lutheran Church of St. Paul, and also serves as music director for Mixed Precipitation's critically-acclaimed Pickup Truck Opera. Gary's scores have been presented by BBC Two, C-SPAN, Minnesota Opera, Madison Square Garden, and the Center for Interfaith Relations. A *Chorus America* Education and Community Outreach Award recipient and American Composers Forum grantee, he earned music degrees with honors from Northern Kentucky University and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Called "*terrifie*" by Mpls.St.Paul Magazine, his performing career spans opera, concert, ensemble, and film, including forty stage roles and appearances with the Boston Pops, Kennedy Center, Festival Musique en l'Île de Paris, *Birdland*, American Bach Soloists, and NPR's Tiny Desk Concerts. Gary's discography includes a dozen recordings with *Cantus*, alt-rock and classical discs, and three solo albums.

## **MEET THE COMPOSER**

**Nathan Hall** uses music to explore a variety of fields including science, nature, the fine arts, history, and sexuality. There is an emotional resonance present in all of Nathan's works, from his traditional classical pieces for chamber ensembles to experimental electronic pieces, sound sculptures, and multimedia projects. Nathan's drive for making site-specific work is tied to his passions for travel and cultural exchange. Other works are inspired by the composer's sexuality, creating a special intimacy between performer, place, and audience.

Nathan is a former Fulbright Fellow to Iceland and he holds his Doctorate in Musical Arts (DMA) from CU Boulder. He holds a BA from Vassar College and MM from Carnegie Mellon. His works have been performed and exhibited in 14 countries and 12 US States. He lives in Denver. www.nathanhall.net

## **LOVE, DEATH, WHAT ELSE?**



I had the initial idea for this work many years ago. I wanted to compose music for and about LGBTQ elders. As a middle-aged queer man, I wanted to discover what I could learn from an older generation of the queer community. What stories could they share?

After receiving the McKnight fellowship, I found myself able to answer these questions in the Twin Cities by meeting residents at and around Spirit on Lake, and writing *Love, Death, What Else?*. The title recalls themes in this work: love and joy, humor and reflection.

These are stories about relationships, families, and yes, death. Many of the people I interviewed didn't fear death, but felt like there was (and is) never enough time to fulfill one's goals. I think many of us can relate to that--so I am honored that you chose to be here today to listen to this new work.




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## **MEET OUR INTERIM DIRECTOR**

David is the founder and music director of the First Readings Project, a chamber choir that acts as a resource for composers in the development of new work. He has won numerous grants, awards, and residencies from organizations such as ASCAP, the Jerome Foundation, the American Composers Forum, and was the recipient of the 2001 McKnight Fellowship for Performing Musicians, along with his a cappella group Dare To Breathe.
