Jan 20-21 • Rabbi Joshua Lesser

Rabbi Lesser is the spiritual leader of Congregation Bet Haverim, a diverse and growing Reconstructionist synagogue founded by gay and lesbian Jews. Rabbi Lesser, a long-time activist, established the Rainbow Center, a nonprofit organization serving gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered, and questioning folks and their families. He served as a Co-Chair of Georgians Against Discrimination, the organization that was dedicated to defeating Georgia's Marriage Amendment Bill. As a founding board member of the Faith Alliance of Metro Atlanta and a member of World Pilgrims, Rabbi Lesser is committed to building bridges and deepening understanding between people of all faiths.

Jan 27-28 • Imam Daayiee Abdullah

Imam Abdullah, 52, a Black-American, 20year convert to the Islamic faith, is a scholar of Chinese and Arabic Languages and Literature (GU); a former public interest lawyer, and a specialist in Shari'ah Sciences/Quranic Interpretation, Daayiee holds master degrees in Middle Eastern and North African Studies in comparative legal systems (Judaic, Christian and Islamic) and has lived in several Middle Eastern/North African and Southeast Asian Muslim countries as a student and ex-pat worker. Daayiee has written on such topics as "A Homosexual Positive Interpretation of the Lut Story in the Holy Quran," "The Need for Homosexual Marriage in Islam," and "Homosexual Caricatures in the Holy Quran, Arab and Islamic Literatures." Daayiee has been Moderator for the Muslim Gay Men Discussion Group since 2000 (serving over 1240 members worldwide) and is a former Board member of Al-Fatiha Foundation for GLBTIQ Muslims.

Artistic Director Jane Ramseyer Miller

Jane Ramseyer Miller is in her twelfth year as Artistic Director for One Voice Mixed Chorus. She holds Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota and a BA in Psychology from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada. Ramseyer Miller has served as Music Director for several church choirs as well as for TransVoices, Calliope Women's Chorus, Fierra Voce Femmina, and Voices for Peace – a multi-cultural youth choir. Ramseyer Miller's compositions are published by Yelton Rhodes Music and Pilgrim Press and her choral setting of Langston Hughes' *A Dream Deferred* was premiered in 2004 as a commission awarded by the DaCapo Chorus of Waterloo, Ontario. She especially enjoys creative arts collaborations and has created choral music with 15-Head Theater Lab, The Women's Cancer Resource Center, Shakopee Women's Correctional Facility, In the Heart of the Beast Puppet and Mask Theatre, Mu Daiko and District 202, among others.

Accompanist Philip Everingham

Philip Everingham, a native of Springfield, Ohio, has collaborated with singers throughout the United States and Austria, specializing in a variety of art song and opera repertoire. He has served as coach/accompanist for various opera companies, including the Fargo/Moorhead Opera productions of Carlyle Floyd's "Susannah," Mozart's "Die Zauberflote" and their upcoming production of Bizet's "Pearl Fishers," as well as several productions at the University of Minnesota and Opera in the Ozarks. Currently, he is concluding his Doctorate of Musical Arts at the University of Minnesota where he is researching Finnish composer Yrjö Kilpinen's songs set to the text of Swedish poet Erik Blomberg. His research took him to Finland in the fall of 2006 to perform a concert series beginning at the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki with baritone Peter Halverson.

Operations Manager Ann Follett

Ann Follett comes to One Voice with an extensive background in screenwriting, filmmaking, arts administration and community activism. She was an active singer and member of Calliope Women's Chorus for six years and sang in a five-person vocal improvisation group for two years. In addition to her work with One Voice, Ann is currently working on the documentary, "Go Oaks! Taking a Stand on Sacred Land," and is writing a series of first-person screenplays. Fortunately, Ann also loves attending meetings.

OVation Ensemble Coach Randi Grundahl

OVation Ensemble Coach Randi Grundahl is very pleased to be working with OVation and has enjoyed singing with this talented group of singers. She is also a choir director at the Visitation School in Mendota Heights and is music directing several shows in Hudson, Wisconsin, and at Macalester College. When she's not conducting, teaching, or directing, she's arranging and composing while trying to perform.

For several years One Voice Mixed Chorus has received funding from the Minnesota State Legislature through a grant from the Metro Regional Arts Council (MRAC). This year these funds are helping to cover the costs of our Reclaiming Faith concerts; however, MRAC's funds have been seriously reduced and fewer resources are now available. In 2003 the Legislature cut arts funding by 32% which severely impacted the funding available to organizations like ours. This year arts advocates and Minnesota Citizens for the Arts are asking legislators to "please restore the arts funding that was cut in 2003." 




